From February 2007 to August 2010 she was Research Curator at Hampton Court Palace and is now an External Consultant to Historic Royal Palaces.

Suzannah has written and contributed to a number of publications including "1536: The Year that Changed Henry VIII" which is an engaging and splendidly readable account of a pivotal year in Henry's fascinating but terrible reign

Suzannah has also appeared on a number of television shows including BBC's The One Show, Channel 4's Time Team and the History Channel. Suzannah has also contributed to a number of radio programmes.
